You should get to school not later than 8.40 am, this is so that you are ready for the first period which starts at 8.50 am.


There are six periods in a day. Each period is 48 minutes. There is a 12 minute homegroup session everyday after recess.

Across the week Year 7 students complete the following subjects:



You will be allocated a homegroup for example 7A, 7B, 7C etc and attend each of your classes together.

Whilst you will be designated a homegroup room you will need to move classrooms for your specialty subjects such as Science, Physical Education etc.

GETTING READY FOR SCHOOL

There are two different types of school uniform at Williamstown High School - academic and physical education.

The **ACADEMIC UNIFORM** is worn on school days when there is no scheduled physical education or sports lessons.

The **PHYSICAL EDUCATION UNIFORM** is to be worn on days that you have a scheduled Physical Education or Sport session.

There are no changing facilities at the Bayview Campus so you are able to wear your sport uniform all day on the school days that you have these subjects.

The school uniform can be purchased from our uniform supplier - Dobsons. There is a uniform store based at the Bayview Campus.







BY TRAIN

SCHOOL

GYMNASIUM CONDITION ROOM






Combination locks are purchased through our book supplier - JP Books. We strongly recommend having a practice opening and closing your combination lock at home!


On the first day of school you will be given a hard copy of your timetable like the example shown below.



You will need to read your timetable and collect all of your materials that you will need for your Period 1 and 2 class. You cannot access your locker between periods only before school at recess and lunchtime.

Using this timetable as an example on a Thursday morning you would need to collect your Maths (blue folder) and French (purple folder) materials for Period 1 and 2.

SCHOOL ROUTINES



As a class you will need to line up outside your classroom with your materials ready. Your teacher will greet you at the door and give you instructions regarding your entry task.

Entry Routine

- Students line up in pairs outside the classroom with their materials readv.
- Students wait quietly for teacher instructions regarding the entry task.
- Teacher greets the class at the door, as they calmly and quietly enter the learning space to complete the entry task.

Gaining Attention

- Teacher uses a cue to start. counting down from 5 to alert students that they want focus on them.
- Students close devices, unless instructed otherwise, and direct their attention towards the teacher.



Exit Routine


- At the conclusion of learning. teacher asks students to tidy their learning space and stand behind their chairs.
- Teacher gives final instructions to students: such as a review of learning intentions and success criteria, a summary task and a reminder of any homework tasks.
- Teacher dismisses students in an orderly fashion.

All of your lessons at Williamstown High School are structured on our SIMPLE instructional model.


The SIMPLE model reinforces classroom routine and promotes explicit teaching.


You will practise your skills in active listening, contributing to class discussions and delivering presentations.

WHAT HAPPENS DURING PE LESSONS?

Humanities covers four main learning areas – History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship and Economic & Business.

In year 7 Humanities we will cover:

- · First nation's history
- Ancient Egypt
- Water as a resource & the water cycle
- Liveability (why we live where we live)
- Entrepreneurship & innovation
- Principles of Australia's legal system

In humanities lessons, you will need to bring your text book, an exercise book to write in, your device and a folder to store your documents in to every lesson.





PE lessons in Year 7 at Willi High are all about introducing you to lots of different sports whilst we support you in getting to know your peers.

We start the year with some fun minor games to ease your transition into Secondary School and get to know you each as individuals. We then move on to a fundamental motor skills unit where we begin to get to know your individual strengths and look for opportunities to involve you in a number of different interschool sports. In Term 1 you will also have the athletics carnival and swim gala to look forward to with plenty of opportunity for participations.

Throughout the rest of the year we will cover a number of sports including; cricket, softball, volleyball, basketball, soccer, lacrosse, Netball, Beach Sports, Lifesaving and many more.

During sport you have the opportunity to choose from a number of sport options to take part in the activity that you are most interested in. During these lessons the teacher will support you in learning and developing your skills in this sport, and applying them to game based scenarios.

This is a great way to involve yourself in inter-school sport too, information of these teams will be circulated on the cohort google classroom page.

In addition to practical PE lessons, we also cover classroom sessions in Health. In Year 7 we look at identity and how this shapes how we feel about ourselves and our place in the world. We delve into the norms that society places on different genders and challenge ourselves to access the impact this has on us all. In Semester 2, we cover puberty and change exploring the wonderful world of being a teenager and all the changes to expect. This unit provides students with the tools to understand how puberty impacts both mind and body, and the things we can do to support one another during this time.

We look forward to welcoming you to PE at Williamstown High School.

For Textiles you will be creating felted doorstops and personalised bags. During Wood you will create chopping boards and work on etching for your light boxes.

Every day after recess, you head back to your homegroup room for a quick 12-minute Homegroup Assembly. During this time, teachers mark the roll, check uniforms, and read out the important daily notices so everyone's up to date. There's also a little extra time for other activities, which can include discussion and reflection tasks, trivia and competitions, or just a chance to reset before the next class.

In addition to these daily sessions, the whole Year 7 cohort comes together in the gym for a larger assembly—usually once every two weeks. These bigger gatherings are a chance to share announcements, celebrate achievements, and hear from different teachers and students across the year level.

Homegroup Lesson is a 48 minute period that happens once a week in your homegroup room. Like all other subjects, Homegroup Lesson has a curriculum set within two themes - "Wominjeka" (welcome) for Semester 1 and Friendship for Semester 2. You will complete tasks and workshops that build your social and emotional wellbeing and participate in important lessons about respectful relationships, careers, e-safety and celebrating diversity among other things.

During recess and lunch you can access all the outside spaces of the campus including: the wetlands, oval, synthetic courts, basketball courts, futsal courts, eat fast dining area and atrium. Students can access the library at recess and from 1.04 pm.

The Year 7 area is only available for Year 7 at recess and lunch.

Various lunchtime clubs and different activities run during lunchtimes which will be announced via the daily bulletin.

Canteen

The school canteen can be accessed during recess and lunchtime everyday and has a variety of food that is available to be purchased. A copy of the canteen menu can be found on our school website.


You can place an order for lunch via the app and collect it straight from the canteen at the start of lunch. Details for the app are on our school website.



END OF THE DAY

Study Club is a great place for you to catch up on homework, assessment or seek support from teachers to help you work through a gap in knowledge. It is also a good place for students who are looking for extension opportunities unavailable during class time as well. It is also a conducive space for students to further develop their learning in a positive environment.

The session runs every Wednesday afternoon, straight from the end of the school day until 4:30 PM in the library.

HOMEWORK

One of the main differences between primary and secondary school is the amount of homework set by your teachers.

Your homework will always be focused on helping you remember what you have learned in class, practising what you have learned or committing it to your memory.

Homework is as important as classwork! Putting full effort into your homework is crucial to your success. As with equipment, being organised is the key to your success. If you do not complete your homework the day it is set, it can become a barrier to your learning as you will fall behind.


In order to develop a good homework routine, you must:

- Do your homework on the day it is set. This will prevent homework from "piling up" and becoming unmanageable
- At home, have a designated area where you can avoid distractions. Ideally, you want to work in an area where you can be supervised by your parents. It is a good idea to agree the homework expectations with them. It is important that both students and parents know when, where and for how long you will be working on your homework every day.
- Communicate with your teachers if you need help - let them know if you found a task difficult or too easy. If you were unable to complete a task, it is important for teachers to know why so they can help you.



KEY AREAS AROUND THE SCHOOL





In Years 7 and 8, you will spend at least 1 period a week in the library. During this time, you will engage with different books, stories and texts. You can also access our information books, which you can use across all of your subjects.

Apart from class time, you can come into the library before and after school, and at lunch and recess. During these times, the library is a lively and social space. You can play games, make art, get involved in different activities throughout the year, or just chat with friends.

We also have a student library assistant program!

This is a big community of students who help out in the library: borrowing books, making displays, running events, and helping promote the space to the rest of the school. If you are interested in getting involved, come and speak to one of our friendly librarians.









WHAT SHOULD I DO?

- "My school pants did not dry over the weekend and I can't wear them to school."
- "I forgot my school shoes at my grandparents house. I can't get them for a few days."

Firstly, don't panic! Wearing the correct school uniform is an expectation we have for all students at Williamstown High, however things happen! Have your parents write a note to the Year 7 coordinators, explaining why you are out of uniform and for how long you will be. Take the note to the coordinator's office in the morning before 8:50am or during recess and you will be given a pass. Without a note from home, you may have to attend some reteaching time at recess, lunchtime or afterschool. Your parents/carers will be contacted.

- "I catch the bus to school and it was late today. I did not get to school on time."
- "I slept in! I got to school at 9:00am. I'm late!"

You must go to the front office first and sign in. When you sign in, you will be given a late pass. Go to your locker and then to straight class. You can only enter the class with the late pass. Continued lateness without a valid reason may result in you having to attend some reteaching time at recess. lunchtime or afterschool. Your parents/carers will be contacted.

"I have a dentist appointment and will not get to school until recess."

Go to the appointment! Your parents/carers must add a note on Compass explaining why you are not at school. Once you get to school, go to the Office first and sign in, or have your parents come with you to sign you in.

"I have to leave school at lunchtime to attend an appointment."

Pack your bag and go to the front office. Your parents/carers MUST come into the office and sign you out. You cannot leave on your own, even if your parents have given you permission to do so.

"I need to leave school during period 3 to go to an appointment."

Your parents/carers must come to the front office. A staff member will go to your class and collect you. Your parents will then sign you out and you can leave with them to attend your appointment. They will need to sign you back in at the front office if you return to school.

"I forgot my lunch at home."

Have the school contact home and perhaps your parents can drop it off at the front office for you to collect. If they can't, go and see the Year 7 coordinators who can help.

"I fell over at lunchtime and have grazed my knee."

"I'm feeling sick in class."

If this happens during recess or lunch, go with a friend to the front office to get some first aid. They will assess your injury, treat it and contact home if necessary.

If you start feeling sick during class time, tell your teacher. They will send another student with you to the office with a note. The staff at the front office will help you.

"I have lost my school jumper."

Make sure that you write your name on all uniform items. There are lost property cupboards at the front office and outside the Year 7 coordinators office where you are likely to find it.
